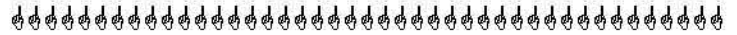

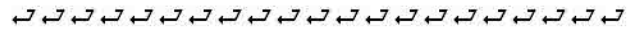
## **Please boil water for drinking until further notice.**
